

AN ORDINANCE of the County of Clallam making it a crime for minors to purchase or attempt to purchase intoxicating liquors.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CLALLAM COUNTY that:

Section I. Except in the case of liquor given to a person under the age of twenty-one years by his parent, guardian, physician or dentist for medicinal purposes, no person shall give or otherwise supply liquor to any person under the age of twenty-one years or permit any person under that age to consume liquor on his premises or on any premises under his control, and it shall be unlawful for any person under the age of twenty-one years to purchase or attempt to purchase, consume or possess intoxicating liquor as defined in Sections 66.04.010 through Section 66.04.380 of the Revised Code of the State of Washington.


Section II. PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject upon conviction to a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment for not more than 30 days in the Clallam County Jail for each such violation.
