ORDINANCE NO. 172, 1982.

An ordinance establishing a public works policy for changing of County road names and adopting a chapter in the Clallam County Code (C.C.C.)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CLALLAM COUNTY COMMISSIONERS:

C.C.C. 9.08.101 Purpose. No written policy governing the changing of names of county roads now exists, and said lack of policy has caused confusion and disagreement between land owners residing on said roads. A policy is needed to establish procedures, including notification of residents on roads of proposed change, and to establish costs thereof consisting of postings of notifications, advertising, mailing of notices, re-signing and any other related costs.

C.C.C. 9.08.020 Petition Required. A petition furnished by the Department of Public Works must be completed by the requestors of county road name changes showing the following:

- A. Name of existing road
- B. Proposed road name
- C. Reason for name change
- D. Signatures of a majority of abutting land owners
- E. Neatly drawn map of the road with ownerships drawn on an 8½" x 14" or larger paper
- F. Names and mailing addresses of all residents and/or land-owners on the road

C.C.C. 9.08.030 Publication and Notification. All requests for road name changes shall be published in the county official newspaper ten (10) days preceding the date of hearing which shall be at a regular meeting of the Board of Clallam County Commissioners. Copies of the hearing will be posted on said road for the same period of time running concurrently, at each end of said road, and at other locations along said road as may be deemed appropriate. Notification of the proposed change and hearing date shall be mailed to each property owner on said road.

C.C.C. 9.08.040 Director's Report. The Department of Public Works shall submit a report to the Board regarding duplication or a similarity of known public or private road names or any other problems proposed road name could cause.

C.C.C. 9.08.050 Expenses. It is further resolved that the sum of two-hundred, fifty dollars (\$250.00) be paid unto the Department of Public Works as compensation of expenses incurred in the advertising, posting of Notice of Hearing, re-signing and any other related costs at the time of request.


C.C.C. 9.08.060 Notification of Name Change. In the event that the Board determines that the road name shall be changed, the Department of Public Works shall notify all applicable public agencies and the abutting land owners as shown on the original petition.


C.C.C. 9.08.070 Severability. If any portion of this ordinance or any application thereof is held invalid or unconstitutional for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion thereof or any application thereof shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the ordinance or its applicability to other persons or circumstances.

C.C.C. 9.08.080 Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after this adoption.


